# **Template for a Dream Interview**

## (Based on All About Dreams, Gayle Delaney, chapter 5)

Here are the stages of a dream interview:

- 1 Tell the dream
- 2 Diagram and outline the dream (see below)
- 3 Ask the dreamer to define and describe each major element of the dream
- 4 Restate or condense the description given by the dreamer
- 5 Bridge to real life
- 6 Summarise the dream
- 7 Ask the dreamer what remains unclear

Remember: You as interviewer are not here to show off what you know, but to find out what the dreamer knows.

Delaney divides the dream into six elements:



#### The Steps of a Dream Interview

- 1 Will you tell me your dream? [Interviewer should feel free to take notes, or dreamer can share a printout of the dream]
- What feelings are you most aware of in the dream?
- 3 Have you felt this feeling in your past or current life?
- 4 When was the first or most recent time you felt this way?

## **Settings**

- 5 Describe the opening (or next) setting.
- 6 What sort of place is [for example, ...a shop? ...a school? ...a town??]
- 7 What is [this place] like in real life?
- 8 What is [this place] like in your dream?
- 9 How does it feel to be in this setting?
- 10 So, this setting is [summarise the description], right?
- Does this setting, which you describe as [X], remind you of anything?
- 12 How so?

#### **People** 13 Who is [X] – pretend I've never heard of them. 14 What is [X] like in waking life? Can you describe in three words? 15 What is [X] like in your dream? 16 What is [X] doing in your dream? 17 So [X] is [summarise the description], right? 18 Does [X], who you describe as [description], remind you of anyone in your life, or any part of yourself? 19 How so? Animals 20 What is a [Animal] like? Pretend I've never seen one. 21 How would you describe the personality of a [Animal]? 22 What is the [Animal] doing in your dream? 23 So, the [Animal] is [summarise the description], right? 24 Is there anyone in your life, or any part of yourself that reminds you of a [Animal], which you describe as [description]? 25 How so? **Objects** 26 What is a [object]? Pretend I've never seen one. 27 What is the [object] in your dream like? Is it different from a normal [object]? 28 Do you like or dislike [object]? 29 So, the [object] in your dream is [description], right? 30 Does the [object] in your dream, which you describe as [description], remind you of anything in your life? Does it remind you of anyone or of any part of yourself? 31 How so? **Feelings** 32 How do you feel at this moment in the dream? [Ask at any point, but especially at the end] 33 Tell me about this feeling. 34 Tell me about a time (or the last time) you felt this way. 35 Let me see if I understand – you are/were feeling [feeling], right? Does this feeling remind you of anything in your current life? 36 37 How so? Action 38 Describe the major action or event in this scene. 39 Why do humans do such things and how do you feel about it? 40 Does this [action] remind you of any situation in your life? 41 42 How would you describe the central plot of this dream? Does it remind you of any

situation in your life?

Will I summarise the descriptions and bridges so far, or would you like to?

- So, in this part of the dream [action], which you described as [description], which reminded you of [bridge]...
- Does all this remind you of anything else?
- How do you understand your dream now? Are there parts that remain unclear?
